Developmental Reading Assessment (DRA)

The DRA is a method for assessing and documenting primary students' development as readers over time. Its purpose is to identify students' reading levels based on accuracy, fluency, and comprehension.

Fountas & Pinnell Benchmark Assessment System (BAS)

The Fountas & Pinnell Benchmark Assessment Systems provides teachers with precise tools and texts to observe and quantify specific reading behaviors, and then interpret and use that data to plan meaningful instruction.
