Fountas & Pinnell Benchmark Assessment System (BAS)

The Fountas & Pinnell Benchmark Assessment Systems provides teachers with precise tools and texts to observe and quantify specific reading behaviors, and then interpret and use that data to plan meaningful instruction.

Measure of Academic Progress (MAP)

MAP is a standardized, computer-based test to measure student achievement and growth in math and reading.

i-Ready Diagnostic

The i-Ready Diagnostic is an adaptive assessment that adjusts its questions for each student. As a student answers correctly, the questions get more difficult. As a student answers incorrectly, the questions get easier. This adaptability allows the i-Ready Diagnostic to identify the strengths and opportunities for growth of each student.

Beginning the 2023-2024 school year the MAP standardized test switched to the i-Ready adaptive assessment.
