School Improvement Council Goal for 2016-2017

Improve School-Home-Community Relations

Based on a review of the 2015 parent survey data that indicated parents wanted more communication regarding their child's academic progress, the SIC promoted PowerSchool Parent Portal and created a Parent Portal User Guide in 2015. In April of 2015, 79% of students' parents had a Parent Portal account giving them constant access to their child's academic progress. At the beginning of the 2016 school year, each parent received a PowerSchool Parent Portal application and user guide on Registration Day. Presently, 99% of students' parents have a Parent Portal account. Parent Portal applications will be offered to parents on Registration Day for the 2017-2018 school year.

In an effort to find other ways to improve overall relations between home and school, the SIC reviewed All Hands on Deck: Tools for Connecting Educators, Parents, and Communities by Brad Currie. Afterwards, the SIC discussed a need for a social media outlet. It was noted that 332 parents and 22 teachers use School/Class Dojo to communicate important information and reminders such as school events, homework, and test dates, while other teachers use Remind 101 in the same way. These applications allow teachers and parents to communicate in ways similar to Twitter or Facebook.

In addition, the SIC parent and community members assisted in finding local presenters for Woodruff Elementary School's first Diversity Celebration, which was held on February 24, 2017. Each homeroom class chose to attend 4 of the 15 different sessions offered, in which the students engaged with internal and external school community members in various ways to learn about cultures from around the world. Some of the sessions included learning African dance, participating in a traditional Mexican birthday party for a child, playing Jamaican music with steel drums, storytelling, and learning the history of the Gullah people.






