School Improvement Goal 2018-2019

Improve Home-School Relations and Community Partnerships through communication and collaboration

Upon review of the parent survey data, 49.5% of parents feel they are invited to visit their child's classroom during school day hours. Whereas, 44.9% of parents feel they are not invited to visit the classroom. In order to facilitate a home-school relation, WES provides various programs or events, such as Science Fair Viewing, Family Literacy Night, Awards Day programs, Book Fair, Special Menu, and PTO events. This year, 4th and 5th grade provided orientation sessions to inform parents of classroom expectations, rules, and procedures for their children. Teachers also provided information for upcoming events and field trip opportunities for parents to serve as volunteers. Also this year, PTO parent volunteer involvement has increased evidenced by: distribution of fundraising items, collecting and counting Box Tops, and heading and serving as sole operators of events such as, Muffins for Moms and Donuts for Dads.

The SIC committee reviewed current programs and events offered to students and parents at Woodruff Elementary. After last year's Diversity Day success, WES hosted a second Diversity Day in which students learned about China, France, and/or Mexico. This event prompted the SIC committee to discuss a future STEAM event focused around science, technology, ELA, arts, and mathematics. In order to foster community involvement, the SIC committee invited Robb Williams from Triple Tree Aerodrome to present information in regards to how students, parents, and teachers can become involved in learning about areas of aviation, engineering, and mechanics. WES continues to partner with Hearts for School, which provides services for at risk 3rd grade students. As a result of all of these efforts, WES plans to continue its efforts in promoting homeschool and community partnerships.





3rd Grade MAP Scores 2018




4th Grade MAP Scores 2018
