### “Wildcat Wows”

### Student Achievement Update

#### **iReady Assessment-Reading and Math**

iReady is an engaging online assessment and instruction program for students in K-4<sup>th</sup> grades. iReady’s adaptive test identifies students’ strengths and weaknesses in reading and math. Once students finish the Diagnostic, the results are used to provide customized and differentiated instruction. Typically, our students are assessed through iReady three times a year.

It is important to acknowledge the impact of Covid-19 on student academic achievement. Our staff is using students’ individual iReady data to identify learning gaps that may have occurred due to the March 2020 school closure/transition to emergency Distance Learning and to plan instruction specific to students’ needs. Due to the lingering impact of COVID-19, our goal is to accelerate student learning and increase the percentage of students meeting their stretch growth goal. iReady will support your child whether he is above grade level, on level, or below grade level (i-Readycentral.com).

*Typical Growth marks the median annual iReady Diagnostic Scale Score growth for each grade and placement.*

*Stretch Growth is the academic year growth the student should target to put them on a path toward attaining or maintaining grade level proficiency.*

#### **SC Ready-ELA (Reading and Writing) and Math**

The SC READY testing program was first administered in spring of 2016. The SC READY assessments are aligned to the new South Carolina College and Career Ready curriculum standards and assess student achievement in English Language Arts (Writing and ELA) and mathematics. Test items range from multiple-choice questions to extended response items as well as a Text-Dependent Analysis response.

Four performance levels were established to reflect the knowledge and skills exhibited by students on SC READY:

- Exceeds: The student exceeds the minimum grade level standard.
- Meets: The student met the grade level standard.
- Approaches: The student’s performance is close to the grade level standard.
- Not Met: The student did not meet the grade level standard.

As SC READY was developed to measure the SC College and Career Ready Standards, no national comparisons are available.

The passage of Read to Succeed legislation in South Carolina has resulted in more of an emphasis on reading instruction over the past few years. There is a protected instructional time (90 minutes daily) for reading. In many instances, our students are performing better in ELA than math, and there is a need to plan accordingly.

### School Climate (Spring 2021 State Report Card Surveys)

Due to the number of requests for DESA students to attend the D5 Virtual Academy in August 2020, eight of our teachers taught virtually. In January 2021, five teachers returned to face to face instruction due to student requests to return to face to face instruction. Three teachers finished the school year in the D5 Virtual Academy.
