# Annual Report to the People for the 2009-2010 School Year

#### "Wildcat Wows"

- Met Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) per federal expectations set for student achievement data (PASS).
- Jennifer Rivera was the Terrific Kid of the Year for Duncan Elementary School.
- Duncan Elementary School provided the following extracurricular programs: Wildcat Chorus/Drama, Creations, K-Kids, and our "Early Bird" Extended Day Program.
- Duncan Elementary has a total of eight teachers who have earned National Board Certification.
- Shirley Hames, First Grade Literacy Interventionist, was named Duncan Elementary School Distinguished Reading Teacher of the Year
- Lisa Russell, First Grade Teacher, was named Duncan Elementary School Teacher of the Year.
- Francine Pullen was named Duncan Elementary School Support Employee of the Year.
- Title I funds provided Interwrite Boards for our Kindergarten and First Grade Classrooms.
- Title I funds provided Interwrite Pads for our Second-Fourth Grade Classrooms.

#### **Our Duncan Wildcats Care**

- Duncan Wildcats' "Relay for Life" Team raised \$5,899.91 for the American Cancer Society.
- 22.41% (17.7) of our employees participated in the first Relay for Life 5K sponsored by FCA.
- United Way participation by the staff was 100% (fourth consecutive year) with contributions totaling \$3,343.00

## MAP (Measures of Academic Performance) Goals for 2009-2010

- The percentage of students meeting their individual target goals on MAP in reading and math will increase each year.
- All students will show significant gains in reading and math (specific attention given to the strand within each content area rather than overall score).
  Data walls in 2<sup>nd</sup>-4<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms display this information.

## **State Report Card**

Duncan Elementary School received an Absolute Rating of "Average" on the SC School Report Card. We met 17 out of 17 objectives; therefore, we met "Adequate Yearly Progress" as defined by the US Department of Education for the third year in a row. Our Growth Rating was "Good", which means that our school's performance "exceeded the standards for progress toward the 2020 SC Performance Vision".
