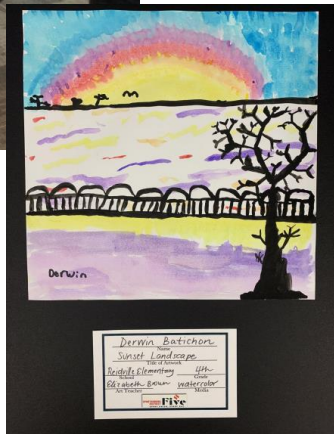
Mission and Vision

- Create an outdoor Thinking and Writing Reflection Trail

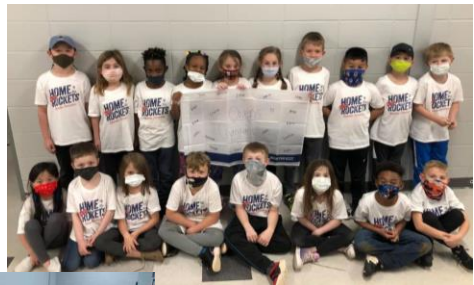
