

School Progress and Highlights

- Paula Quinby, one of our 4th grade teachers, was named Teacher of the Year and District Teacher of the Year.
- Three classrooms are using 1:1 student laptops to encourage and promote blended learning.

- Mrs. Tonya Williams, one of our third grade teachers, was recently awarded a Spartanburg Jr. League grant for her proposal, "Wiggle While You Learn." This promotes active student learning in her room with the use of hokki stools.
- Mrs. Kimberly Rozman, school counselor, was awarded a grant from D5's Teacher Forum for an additional afterschool club to practice yoga and mindfulness.
- Student achievement and leadership is recognized and encouraged through school opportunities such as Student Council (K5-4th grade), Morning Show, Wee Deliver, Rocket Squad, STAR students, Rocket Stars, Fish Feeders, Flag Patrol, and Technology Team.
