

Goal for 2022-2023:

Even as we have distanced ourselves from COVID, our students are still battling learning loss as a repercussion of COVID-19. In order to close the learning gaps that our students have, this year we placed our emphasis on helping students reach their iReady Stretch Growth target by the Spring iReady diagnostic.


Stretch Growth is an ambitious but attainable level of annual growth which puts below-grade level students on a path towards proficiency and on-grade level students on a path to achieve/maintain advanced proficiency levels.



This year we saw significant gains for students in math. We were able to lower our student population in the "at risk for tier 3" category by 18%. In addition, we were able to move students from the "tier 2" category at a rate of 15% while increasing our students in "tier 1" by 32%. We saw significant tier movement with our students this year due to our academic focus on stretch growth.

Below, you will see how students were impacted due to stretch growth within each subgroup for math. We are seeing our most significant movement for students in "mid or above grade level" with 42% of students meeting stretch growth and 56% of those students having improved placements. Additionally, we are seeing significant movement for students in "two grade levels below" and "three or more grade levels below" with 32% of students meeting their stretch growth and up to 87% of students having an increased placement!

Overall Growth for iReady Reading 2022 - 2023

This year we saw significant gains for students in reading. We were able to lower our student population in the "at risk for tier 3" category by 15%. In addition, we were able to move students from the "tier 2" category at a rate of 2% while increasing our students in "tier 1" by 17%.

Below, you will see how students were impacted due to stretch growth within each subgroup for reading. We are seeing our most significant movement for students in "mid or above grade level" and "early on grade level" with 34% of students meeting stretch growth and 56% of those students having improved placements. Additionally, we are seeing significant movement for students in "three or more grade levels below" with 25% of students meeting their stretch growth and 71% of students having an increased placement!
