Florence Chapel Middle School is a student-centered school with an outstanding, supportive environment that allows students every opportunity to succeed.

Our faculty remains committed to the development of students in areas of academics, athletics, fine arts, and service to others. We are proud to say that our students achieved success in each of these areas. Our students continue to score high in their PASS tests compared to the state. Our ESEA grade improved last year to 94.9 - A. We are continuing to strive to improve our students' scores in all areas.

This year thirty of our eighth grade students were named South Carolina Junior Scholars for their outstanding scores on the PSAT. Seven of our seventh grade students, received state level recognition as Duke University TIP scholars for their exceptional ACT/SAT scores. Our school-wide reading initiative was very successful with every teacher focusing our students on reading/writing in all classes.

Our athletic program had a very successful year in volleyball, basketball and cheerleading, with undefeated teams in seventh grade football, eighth grade football and wrestling.

Our fine arts program did an exceptional job this year working on the artistic, dramatic and musical talents of our students. Our orchestra and band programs received superior ratings in their competitions and our students' artwork is proudly displayed across our county and in every hallway of our school. Our Technology Student Association was named First Overall SCTSA Chapter for middle schools.

Service is a very important part of our school, allowing students to take leadership roles and give back to the community. Our students served the community through their participation in Relay for Life, Pennies for Patients, Spartanburg Humane Society, Middle Tyger food drives, paper recycling, and many other opportunities.
