As a result of the 2022-2023 academic school year, McCracken Middle school improved from a score of 42 with a state classification of “average” to a score of 49 with a state classification of “good” on its annual 2022-2023 state report card. Students scoring “met” or “exceeding” in English was above the state and district average. While in math, only 36% of students scored “met” or “exceeding”.

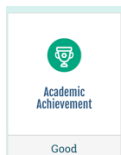
Mission:

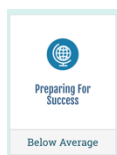
Vision:

- The curriculum includes the knowledge and skills for student success at all levels.*



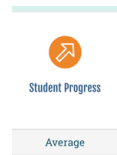

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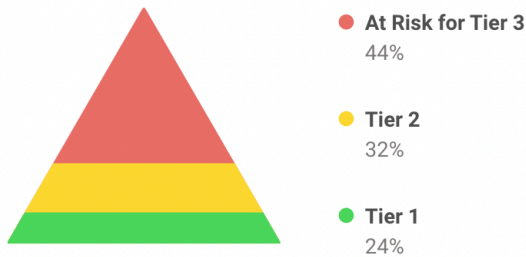

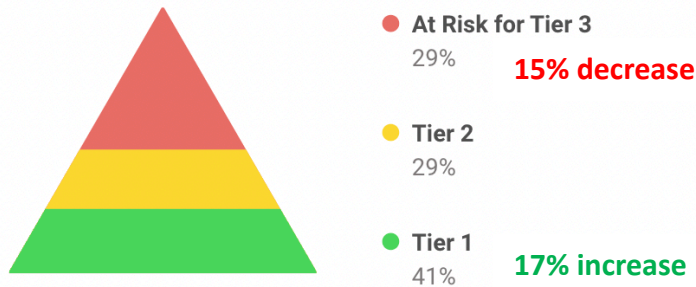
Fall Math Goals 2023

Decrease the percentage of students scoring in Tier 3 i-Ready to 25% by Spring 2024

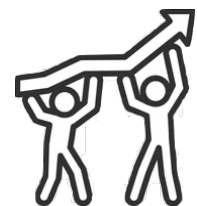
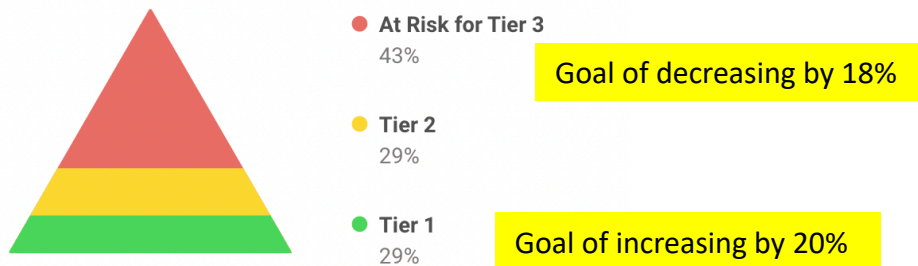
MATH: Fall, 2022



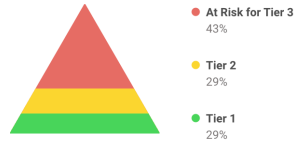
MATH: Spring, 2023



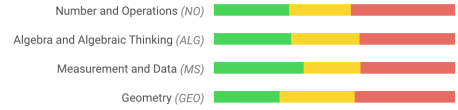
MATH: Fall, 2023

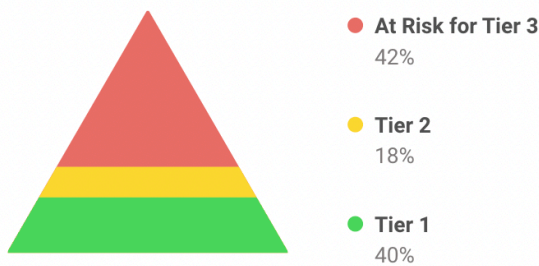

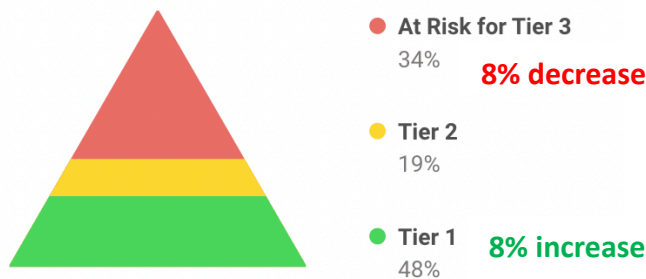

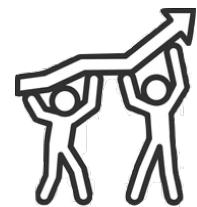
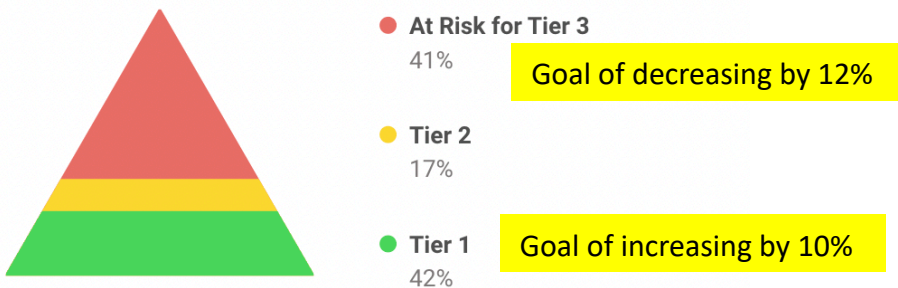
READING: Fall, 2022



READING: Spring, 2023

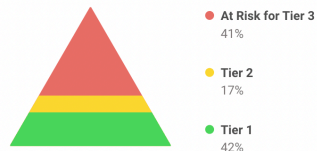


READING: Fall, 2023

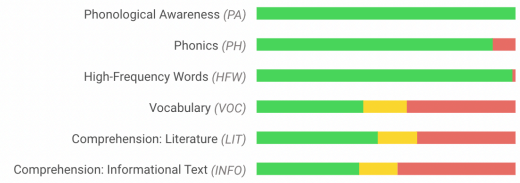
