

SHS 21-22 SIC GOALS

- The 2021-2022 School Improvement Council's first goal included the implementation of an engaged plan for Viking Power Hour. The purpose of Viking Hour is to allow students to eat lunch, get tutoring, attend club meetings, participate in intramural sports, or engage in a variety of other activities. It is intended to enable kids to make the most of their lunch hour and obtain the additional assistance they need without having to remain after school as often. The benefits of Power Hour including strengthening relationships between teachers and students, giving students more time to access the Media Center and labs on campus, offering on-campus tutoring during the day, and giving students the opportunity to engage in fun, stress-free activities with their peers. SIC suggested doing a parent, student survey concerning the effectiveness of Viking Hour.
- In addition to the Viking Hour, it was suggested that at-risk pupils get one-on-one tutoring. During the 2021-2022 academic year, an at-risk senior/mentor program was implemented. Using community resources and volunteers, SIC aimed to expand this program to offer mentors for at-risk children on each grade level.
- SIC's second goal involved developing a school wide initiative
 to reward positive student behavior and commend everyday
 teacher accomplishments. Parents and community member
 suggested "Viking Bucks" to reward students for positive
 behaviors including grades, acts of kindness, etc. SIC Students
 proposed presenting teachers with monthly mementos of
 gratitude for their efforts.
- SIC advocated for a reduction in student parking off campus by recommending modifications to the student parking permit and the Live at 25 requirements. This objective would promote student security and minimize student tardiness.
- Finally, SIC suggested the implementation of parent and community-led seminars during Viking Hour. These workshops would provide students with the opportunity to acquire essential real-world skills, such as stress management, etiquette, tax preparation, building and maintaining credit, budgeting/finances, car maintenance, home economics (cooking, laundry, etc.), and organization skills. The advantage of this objective would be to prepare students for life beyond high school by equipping them with skills that reduce stress and anxiety at the notion of facing the world without parental structure.

Spartanburg High School serves Spartanburg School District 7 for grades 9 – 12. Spartanburg is a small city of 37,500 within a county of 300,000. Our student enrollment is 2,020 and we have 165 professionals on staff. SHS is accredited by Cognia - SC Department of Education.
