SHS 22-23 SIC GOALS

- In 2022-2023, SHS SIC's goals for the school year included continuing to develop ways to provide a more structured and engaging plan for Power Hour. The mission/goal is for students to focus on authentic literacy taking time during that hour to find areas to read, develop relationships with their teachers, and prepare for tests SAT, ACT, Career Ready 101, etc. Teachers will have 25 minutes of duty-free lunch. Teachers will set office hours for tutoring, unit recovery, make-up work, club meetings, and intramural activities. Mandatory tutoring would take place in either Part A or Part B using priority scheduling. Students will be given freedom to move throughout the entire campus and eat in assigned locations. The advantages of Power Hour were found to include improved relationships between professors and students, greater time for students to use the Media Center and other campus laboratories, and on-campus tutoring during the day.
- The second goal involved developing a school wide initiative to reward positive student behavior, commend everyday teacher accomplishments, and raise overall school morale. By raising overall school morale, SIC sought to increase school pride. Parents and community members suggested "Viking Bucks" to reward students for positive behaviors including grades, acts of kindness, etc. To commend teacher accomplishments, SIC students proposed presenting teachers with monthly mementos of gratitude for their efforts. An additional suggestion included the naming of teacher superlatives and letters to all teachers at the conclusion of the year. It was also suggested to have food trucks during lunch once or twice every nine weeks for students as well as staff. Finally, to raise school morale and increase pride, suggestions were made to incorporate more student/staff activities to include intramurals and competitions, to have more class competitions, and to gain community sponsors for gift cards and prizes to be randomly given out to staff members and students.
- Another goal of the 2022-2023 SHS SIC was to begin generating ideas to improve the Senior Study Hall Lounge. Seniors are allowed to register for a period of Senior Study Hall after meeting the required GPA standard and after completing the number of course requirements. The objective of improving the Senior Study Hall Lounge is to motivate all Seniors to complete the necessary requirements to have the opportunity to enroll.
- SIC suggested changes to the student parking permit to promote a decrease in student parking off-campus. This would allow seniors to personalize their allotted parking places while also lowering the cost of student parking for other students. As seniors would be given the chance to showcase their originality, distinctiveness, and school spirit, this aim would boost student security, reduce student tardiness, and increase school pride.
- The adoption of parent-and community-led workshops during Viking Hour was the final suggestion made by SIC. Through these programs, students would get the chance to learn crucial real-world skills like stress management, etiquette, tax preparation, establishing and maintaining credit, budgeting/finances, automobile repair, home economics, and organizational abilities. By providing students with skills that lessen stress and anxiety associated with the idea of facing the world without parental structure, this mission would have the advantage of preparing them for life after high school.


