SIC Annual Goals

Reading (iReady):

- Students in Tier 3 (most at risk) decreased from 35% to 19%
- Tier 2 decreased from 50% to 29%
- Tier 1 (on or above grade level) increased from 16% to 52%—a historic high for our school

Math (iReady):

- Tier 3 decreased from 35% to 11%
- Tier 2 decreased from 56% to 37%
- Tier 1 increased from 8% to 53%—another record-breaking achievement

Discipline referrals fell to 227, the lowest ever recorded—proof that when students feel anchored in care and clarity, they don't just behave better; they believe better.

Additional Information

There exists a strong need to bolster the perceptions of home/school relations with all stakeholders. Various forms of communication from school to parents have been implemented. Student-led conferences made a positive impact on home-school relationships. We need to continue to work to be sure that all stakeholders are satisfied with the home-school relationship. To better support this effort, we are in the process of planning and implementing Parent University.
