Ebenezer Middle School is located in a rural setting and serves approximately 360 students from the surrounding communities. The faculty and staff strive for academic excellence and continuous improvement for every student through a challenging, relevant, standards-based curriculum.

This has been a challenging year due to COVID-19. Parts of the year were spent with the students being fully virtual and then we moved to a schedule where students came to school 2 days per week and the other two were virtual with Wednesday's being Asynchronous. Students still had the right to choose 100% virtual. In Mid -April we returned to school face-to face five days per week and students could still remain virtual. We had 172 out of 360 students return to school face -to -face.

Sixth graders have been our biggest class of returnees. We have had teachers that have offered a variety of computer based activities in order to engage the students. We have administered the MAP assessment to analyze the students strengths and weaknesses. Special emphasis in reteaching has been given to these areas. We look forward to getting back to close to 100% face-to -face teaching at Ebenezer.
