Strategies to Address Challenges

Mayewood Middle School has employed several proven strategies to make significant improvements in student achievement and the school climate. We have addressed our challenges and achieved our goals by:

- Mayewood continues to build a comprehensive and unified system through the understanding and integration of learning supports for all students called Multi-Tiered System of Supports or MTSS.
- A group of teachers were trained by consultants from South Regional Education Board (SREB) in Literacy Design Collaborative or Math Design Collaborative.
- An intervention/enrichment period was added to students' schedules. Students were also able to participate in STEM classes.
- Implementing the READ 180 Lab to close the reading achievement gap.
- Using the TE-21 Benchmark tests to monitor students' growth and academic needs.
- Recruiting, retaining, and supporting highly qualified teachers.
- Mayewood Middle School students participated in Quiz Bowl this year with other middle schools from surrounding counties.
- Implementing the PBIS program.
- Celebrating student and staff achievements each quarter.
