

Mayewood Middle School Goals

Area One: Student Achievement

Goals: The percentage of our students in grades 6-8 who score met and above in ELA as measured by PASS will increase from 75.5% in 2009 to 100% in 2013 – 2014.

The percentage of our students in grades 6-8 who score met and above in mathematics as measured by PASS will increase from 69% in 2009 to 94% in 2013 – 2014.

The percentage of our students in grades 6-8 who score met and above in Science as measured by PASS will increase from 49.5% in 2009 to 76.7% in 2013 – 2014.

The percentage of our students in grades 6-8 who score met and above in Social Studies as measured by PASS will increase from 62.5% in 2009 to 87.5% in 2013 – 2014.

Area Two: Administrative/Teacher Quality

Goals: The percentage of our certified and non-certified staff that are highly qualified will increase to 100% in 2010-2011 through 2013 – 2014.

The percentage of our certified teachers who possess middle school certification will increase to 100% in 2010 – 2011 through 2013 – 2014

Area Three: School Climate

Goal: The number of suspensions will decrease by 10% for the next five years.
