

OURSCHOOL

High Hills Elementary School (HHES) is one of sixteen elementary schools serving students in Sumter School District. HHES serves students in grades 4 and 5 who reside on Shaw Air Force Base and throughout the surrounding rural communities of Sumter County. Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by developing creative and insightful lessons that enhance critical thinking skills.

Our dedicated teachers meet weekly to plan instructional activities that correlate to our state standards. Teachers are provided on-going professional development opportunities to enhance instructional strategies that incorporate technology and higher level thinking skills. We utilize educational research and test data to focus on programs and best practices that will help increase student achievement. The data for High Hills Elementary School is obtained from coursework, assessments and surveys. Information from the South Carolina State Assessments (SCPASS and SCREA-DY), Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) tests, and parent, teacher, and student surveys allows us to assess our instructional program and make programmatic changes as needed. High Hills provides interventions to students performing below grade level. Talented and gifted (TAG) students are served through Quest. In addition to these programs, HHES serves the whole child through related arts and clubs.

We continue to participate in a variety of community activities such as Relay for Life, American Heart Walk, Principal for a Day, Career Day, Earth Day and Team Building Day. Our parents are very supportive and continue to be involved in their child's education by serving on committees and attending workshops.
