SIC Annual Goals

The School Improvement Council is instrumental in the development, implementation and evaluation of the School Renewal Plan. In conjunction with the SIC, four goals have been identified for Oakland Primary School in the areas of Student Achievement, School Climate, and Teacher Administrator Quality.

Student Achievement

Eighty-Five percent of first grade students will score at or above a RIT Score of 185 in Math and 180 in ELA on the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessment by the spring assessment of 2021-2022 school year. Seventy-Five Percent of Kindergarteners will score at or above the state average in English Language Arts (reading) on the spring administration of the South Carolina Reading Readiness Assessment in 2021-2022 school year.

School Climate

The number of discipline referrals that result in suspension or expulsion will decrease by 25% by 2022.

Teacher/Administrator Quality

100% of the certified workforce will remain certified through 2022 utilizing a comprehensive program of recruitment, retention, and professional development.

100% of all certified staff will have completed the requirements for the Read-to-Succeed certificate endorsement by 2022.

Read-to-Succeed

Literacy instruction is at the forefront of nearly all we do at Oakland Primary. Oakland is in full compliance with South Carolina's Read-to-Succeed Legislation. We have a full-time Reading Coach, two Reading Interventionists, and four Paraprofessionals all dedicated to helping students overcome reading deficits. All certified staff are in the process of completing a series of required reading courses leading to the Read-to-Succeed Literacy Endorsement. We maintain a Capstone Interactive Library of more than 1600 books and a Guided Reading Library of more than 5,000 books. Our Media Center has taken a lead in encouraging students to read with a host of reading incentive programs. Oakland participated in Read-Across America Week, Read for the Record, Dr. Seuss' Birthday, and our annual Character Parade. Literacy is at the center of all we do.
