# LITERACY, S.T.E.M., & THE ARTS

Literacy, S.T.E.M. (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math), and the fine arts are at the core of nearly all that we do here at Oakland Primary School as we work to educate the "whole" child. We maintain an online library through Capstone of more than 1900 books, which are available to our students 24 hours a day. 365 days a year. This year, we had the privilege to open our much anticipated Ben Carson Reading Room, one of only 250 across the nation. It became a critical piece of our literacy program, providing students with independent reading time and student choice within a comfortable, inviting classroom. We continued to operate our S.T.E.M. lab with every student visiting once a week to explore hands-on science lessons. Our fine arts program continues to impress producing beautifully detailed student work. Music was also an important part of our daily life at Oakland with students involved in music instruction each week. Our physical education program provides students with movement and conditioning practice to support healthy, life long habits. Our after school tutoring program provided additional support to students twice a week in reading and math. We look forward to supporting students' character development in the coming years as we begin to implement the Leader in Me program this summer. We also provide specialized support to our large military community including a Deployment Group for students with parents who are deployed. Here at Oakland we truly work to "Educate the Whole Child"!
