SIC Annual Goals

The School Improvement Council is instrumental in the development, implementation and evaluation of the School Renewal Plan. In conjunction with the SIC, three goals have been identified for Oakland Primary School in the areas of **Student Achievement, School Climate, and Teacher Administrator Quality.**

Student Achievement

Seventy-five percent of first grade students will score at or above a RIT Score of 185 in Math and 180 in ELA, on the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessment by the spring assessment of 2016-2017. The percentage of Kindergarteners scoring at or above the national average in Mathematics and English Language Arts on the universal screening assessment will increase to 90% on the spring screening by 2016-2017.

School Climate

The number of discipline referrals that result in suspensions will decrease 40% by 2017.

Teacher/Administrator Quality

100 percent of the workforce will remain highly qualified through 2017 by a comprehensive program of recruitment, retention and professional development.

Student Achievement

Each Year the South Carolina Education Oversight Committee is required by law to provide each public school in South Carolina with a Report Card outlining its performance. This “Report Card” includes an Absolute Rating and a Growth Rating. Oakland’s ratings are as follows:

Absolute Rating: Excellent
Growth Rating: Good

In addition to the state rating, the school also receives a grade under the Federal Accountability System. Oakland received an “A” rating under the federal system.
