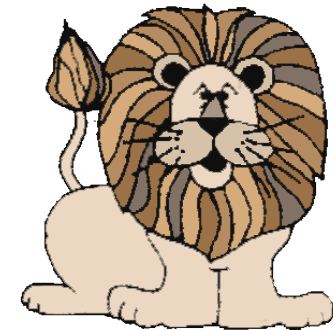
Our Beliefs

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SIC Annual Goals

Student Achievement, School Climate, and Teacher Administrator Quality are the three goals developed in conjunction with our School Improvement Council (SIC). These goals chart the direction for Rafting Creek's school improvement for the next three years.

- ◆ Goal One: By 2017, Math, English Language Arts, Science, and Social Studies scores will increase by 3% each year respectively as measured by the state test.
- ◆ The Percentage of highly qualified staff at 100% will be maintained through 2017 by retention and professional development.
- ◆ We will provide a positive school climate by maintaining or exceeding the state attendance requirement and by having no more than a 10% suspension rate annually.

Student Achievement

Each year the South Carolina Education Oversight Committee is required by law to provide each public school in South Carolina with a Report Card outlining its performance. This "Report Card" includes an Absolute Rating and a Growth Rating. Rafting Creek's ratings are as follows:

Absolute Rating: Average

Growth Rating: Good

In addition to the state rating, the school also receives a grade under the Federal Accountability System. Rafting Creek received an "B" rating under the federal system.
