Performance Goals

As part of our ongoing process of improvement, our School Improvement Council developed three performance goals to guide future growth.

- The percentage of our third grade students who score met and exemplary in mathematics and English language arts as measured by the SC assessment will increase in math from 78.7% in 2012 to 94% in 2017, and in ELA from 80.8% in 2012 to 96% in 2017.
- The number of discipline referrals will decrease by 50% by 2017.
- All teachers, administrators, and paraprofessionals will rank as highly qualified.

Needs Assessment

At Shaw Heights, we are proud of the achievements and improvements we have made in the last three years. During this time, Shaw Heights' ESEA report card grades have been either an A or a B, while our absolute rating has been either excellent or good. On the state end-of-year SC-PASS, all of our subgroups have typically scored at or above the mean state and district scores in all subject areas. In the few cases when scores did not exceed state means, the deficit was very slight.

The new assessment for the 2014-2015 school year was the ACT-Aspire. The results were as follows: English-67.3% met or exceeded; Reading-30.3% met or exceeded; Math- 56.6% met or exceeded; and Writing-12.7% met or exceeded. In all areas except Writing, Shaw Heights Elementary was above the district average. In Math, we were above the state average as well.

However, we also acknowledge that there are areas for improvement which we are addressing to ensure achievement. In general, student achievement across the subject areas has shown a negative trend in performance. It is our goal to see overall performance increase in all subject areas. Gaps exist between our African American subgroup and our white subgroup and our subsidized meal group and our general population. We will strive to close those gaps during the next three years.

Shaw Heights Elementary is a public Title I school located on Shaw Air Force Base. Our school serves both military and non-military families. We strive to create a warm, nurturing environment in which our students can excel. Many parent involvement opportunities are implemented throughout the school year. Teachers work collaboratively with parents to ensure that all children have a positive learning experience. Our School Improvement Council has made a commitment to provide support for the school's mission and performance goals, and to encourage the involvement of the community.

The 2014-15 state assessment was the ACT-Aspire. We are proud that our school was above the district average in all areas except Writing. In addition, we exceeded the state average in the area of Math. Shaw Heights Elementary experienced success with our students, earning a B grade on the Federal Accountability Rating System in 2014. Our test scores on the SC PASS earned our school the honor of the Palmetto Gold Award in 2011 and 2012. Teachers, students, faculty, parents, and community members shared in the celebrations of our success. Some of the steps taken to ensure our students are achieving at a high level include correlating our curriculum with the state standards, participating in on-going professional development, intervention in reading and math, inclusion challenge classes, educational software programs, and a variety of parent involvement activities. We also provide our students opportunities to participate in service projects, such as March of Dimes, Salvation Army canned food drive, community choir performances, Shower Shaw with Cookies/ Cards, and Relay for Life.

Shaw Heights Elementary faculty and staff are dedicated to the mission of educating all children to their highest potential. Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate. By focusing on appropriate academic planning and instruction, our goal is to improve the achievement of each child attending our school.
