Performance Goals
As part of our ongoing process of improvement, our school improvement council developed three performance goals

to guide future growth.

- The percentage of our third grade students who score met and exemplary in mathematics and English language arts as measured by the PASS assessment will increase in math from 78.7% in 2012 to 94% in 2017, and in ELA from 80.8% in 2012 to 96% in 2017.
- The number of discipline referrals will decrease by 50% by 2017.
- All teachers, administrators, and paraprofessionals ranked as highly qualified.

Shaw Heights Elementary is a Title I school providing students in grades two and three a great place to learn. Our School Improvement Council has made a commitment to provide support for the school's mission and performance goals, and to encourage the involvement of the community. We appreciate the support of parents and community members and see this support as an integral part of our success. We received an A grade on the Federal Accountability Rating System in 2013. We earned the Palmetto Gold Award in 2011 and 2012 based on the results of our PASS scores. We are pleased with our students' academic progress.

Our teachers continue to use standard based instructional plans, and provide students with critical thinking skills and problem solving activities. Our teachers utilize test data to focus on programs that will help to increase student achievement by reinforcing weak areas. We have a child study team, computer lab, accelerated reader, parent volunteers, parenting workshops and other programs in place to meet the needs of the students at Shaw Heights Elementary. Our students participate in art, PE and music programs. The Shaw Heights chorus sings at a variety of school functions and community events.

We will continue to utilize research, involve our parents and community members, and focus on appropriate academic planning and instruction to improve the achievement of each child attending Shaw Heights Elementary.
