Performance Goals As part of our ongoing process of improvement, our School Improvement Council developed three performance goals to guide future growth.

- By the end of 2027, the percentage of our third grade students who meet or exceed expectations in English Language Arts and Math as measured by SC-READY will increase in ELA from 29.5% in 2021 to 44.5% in 2027 and in Math from 29.5% in 2021 to 44.5% in 2027.
- By the end of the 2027 school year, the number of discipline referrals will decrease by 25% from 200 in 2020-21 to 150 in 2026-27 school year.
- By the end of the 2027 school year, increase parent and community involvement by providing opportunities to collaborate with stakeholders, enhancing parent conferences, and improve volunteer activities in an effort to increase investment/satisfaction to 80% in five years.

At Shaw Heights Elementary, we are proud of the achievements and improvements we have made in the last three years. Traditionally, our third grade students perform near or on state achievement levels and above district achievement levels on end-of-vear required assessments. Our instructional team utilizes a variety of formal and informal assessments to ensure our students are making progress. Students who are reading and writing below grade level are identified and receive intense small group intervention. In addition, students who are not on grade-level in mathematics receive targeted intervention to improve their skills. Our school offers a tutoring program after school where students work with certified teachers in small groups to strengthen their academics skills.

Our ultimate goal is to ensure that all of our students are college-and career-ready upon graduation. We realize the important foundations for future success that we are building with our students. Therefore, our School Renewal Plan for the next five years includes strategies designed to increase the percentage of our third grade students who meet or exceed expectations on state assessments.

Shaw Heights Elementary is a public Title I school located on Shaw Air Force Base. Our school serves both military and non-military families. We strive to create a warm, nurturing environment in which our students can excel. Virtual parent involvement opportunities were implemented throughout this school year so that we could continue to involve our parents while still observing social distancing guidelines. Our School Improvement Council has made a commitment to provide support for the school's mission and performance goals and to encourage the involvement of the community.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, our entire school community had to adjust to unprecedented and challenging times. To support our community of learners, teachers engaged strategies to positively impact our students' social and emotional well being as well as their academic needs. Our school will be providing an extended learning opportunity in the summer. In addition, we will provide a learning camp prior to the 2022-2023 school year.

Teachers, students, faculty, parents, and community members shared in the celebrations of our success. Some of the steps taken to ensure our students are achieving at a high level include correlation of curriculum with the state standards, on-going professional development, intervention in reading and math, inclusion challenge classes, Chrome books in all classes, educational software programs, and a variety of parent involvement activities.
