SIC Annual Goals

Goal One: By June 2022, the school will achieve a 10 point increase on each of the following assessment and tools as measured by data from the NWEA District Enrollment at Central Carolina Technical College and USC Summary Report and the Annual School Report card: MAP, ACT, EOCEP, ACT WorkKeys and On-Time Early College Program at USC Sumter. Graduation Rate.

Goal Two: By June 2022, the school will routinely show exhibits of exemplary literacy practices as measured by the Read to Succeed Middle and Secondary Exem plary Reflection Tool.

Goal Three: By June 2022, maintain 100% highly qualified teachers and administrators. The school teachers and the administrators will receive and/or maintain a rating of proficient or exemplary as measured by Assisting, Developing and Evaluating Performance of Teachers (ADEPT) and Assisting, Developing and Evaluating Performance of Principals (ADEPP), respectively. Goal Four: By June 2022, the percentage of the schools parents/guardians "satisfied with learning environment" will increase from 72.2% to 82.2% (10 Percentage points) as measured by the parent survey data from the Annual School Report Card.

The following are just a small percentage of the many CHS Points of Pride. Our senior students to date have been awarded \$3,014,678 in scholarship. Our Varsity Girls Basketball Team remains Region VIA Champions for the 7th consecutive year, and one senior accepted a scholarship to Converse College. In the Spring Semester of FCCLA a student became the 1st VP for the State of SC FCCLA for a 2nd time, and will travel to Nashville, Tennessee this summer to the National FCCLA Leadership Meeting July 1-7, 2017. At this same competition, students won a gold metal in the Job Interview Competition, and we won a Bronze metal in the Career Investigation competition. Our Chorus had eight students that went to the SC All-State Chorus competition. Show Choir performed in the Sumter "Jingle for the Arts" in December and the Show Choir was invited to sing for the Rotary Club in December. Advanced Concert Choir was invited to sing in Sumter's Afternoon of Sacred Music at the Holy Comforter Episcopal Church. Additionally, four boys were selected to attend Palmetto Boys State as delegates this year, and two girls were selected for Palmetto Girls State and two alternates. Our school also had the honor of having two of our students, accepted to the Governor's School for the Arts.
