We strive to challenge our students in AAA: Academics, Arts, Athletics. Our graduation rate continues to be one of the highest in the area. Although we have maintained a relatively high longitudinal pass rate for HSAP, we recognize the need to improve our rating. We must implement instructional techniques taking into account varied learning styles while still incorporating the rigor required to make our students competitive in today's workplace. In an effort to achieve a better rating, we applied for and won two grants to set up programs to assist at-risk students. We are also still a part of the High Schools that work improvement initiative.

Crestwood High students will continue to succeed in three areas: Academics, Arts, and Athletics (AAA).

Crestwood will continue to place an emphasis on the fine arts during the 2014-2015 school year. Our arts program received numerous awards in the 2013-2014 school year. Some of the highlights include:

- Hosted the Jacob Lawrence Art Show;
- Singing Knights received a Superior rating at the All-State Chorus Festival;
- The Marching Knights Drum Line received numerous awards;
- Marching Knights placed first in the annual Carolina Carillon Holiday Parade;
- Visual arts students received various awards for competing in various local competitions including the Sumter County Fair and annual state Christmas card competition.

We have accomplished some large athletic gains this year. Our varsity football and our varsity girls basketball teams ranked #1 in the SC High School League Region 6AAA Division. Our varsity girls basketball team made school history by advancing to the state finals and completing the season as the SCHSL Region 6AAA Girls Basketball Championship Runner-up.

Crestwood Needs Assessment

During the recent school renewal process, our school and community representatives agreed that Crestwood High School should continue to focus on student achievement, teacher/administrator quality and retention, and school climate. We met with representatives of our students, staff, and community to analyze our programs and decide what we need to do to address the evident needs. The chosen areas will remain part of our focus for improvement, and strategies have been developed and implemented to address them. This year's assessment was based on data from a variety of sources, including input from our School Improvement Council as well as our faculty and staff. We utilized information from the selfstudy conducted as part of the accreditation process for the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (2004) and updated when we completed the recent (2010) district Advanced accreditation process. In addition, we used our annual School Renewal Plan and the state-of-the-school meetings with the District Instructional leaders. We reviewed data from the HSAP test, state end-of-course tests, attendance reports, and discipline reports. Surveys of students, parents, and staff members were included.

In order to meet the assessed needs of our students, we are continuing to use and adjust the Knights' Advisory Period (KAP). This weekly forty-five minute period promotes social and academic intervention by incorporating tutorials, career planning, credit recovery, and clubs. Following the suggestions of students and staff, we are considering the implementation of a Friday study period during KAP for students to get a head start on their homework for the weekend. Crestwood has been visited by schools outside our district to see our program, and we are currently being considered as presenters at the national High Schools That Work conference this summer. High Schools That Work is a nation-wide comprehensive reform initiative which also helps us to address our assessed needs.
