SIC Annual Goals

- By June of 2023, the percentage of Crestwood High School students classified as “college or career ready”, as determined by the South Carolina School Report Card, will increase by 4% from a baseline of 40.1% (112/279).
- By June of 2023, the percentage of classroom teacher vacancies for more than 9 weeks at Crestwood High School will decrease by 2.00% from a baseline of 12.70% (6.985 teaching vacancies out of 55 positions).
- By June of 2023, the percentage of teachers indicating “The rules for behavior are enforced at my school” on the school report card teacher survey will increase by 2.0% from a baseline of 95.6%.
- By June of 2023, the percentage of students, parents, and teachers indicating that they are “satisfied with home school relations” on the school report card survey will increase by 2.0% from baselines of 82.4%, 80.3%, and 71.0% respectively.
- By June of 2027, students, parents, and staff will have access to a form to self-report work order needs and will receive updates regarding the status of requests.
