This school year, Crestwood High School has 47 juniors and seniors enrolled in dual enrollment courses at Central Carolina Technical College. Additionally, 23 students participate in the Central Carolina Early College program, 8 in the University of South Carolina Sumter Early College program, and 9 are enrolled in Advanced Placement U.S. History. Furthermore, 81 students attend the Sumter County Career and Technology Center.
