Sumter High School continues to provide excellent academic and extra-curricular opportunities to our students. The newly adopted AVID program, along with our challenging curriculum is providing students with the tools needed for success. Sumter High School's graduation rate increased from 78.8% to 83.1%. This rating continues to be higher than schools like ours and the State average. We are proud of the accomplishments of our students and staff.

Since the implementation of AVID in the 2014-2015 school year, many students have shown great potential and are college bound. AVID is an approved elective course taken during the school day. Current 9th and 10th grade students are enrolled in an AVID Elective and challenging classes. Students learn organizational and study skills, work on critical thinking and asking probing questions, get academic help from peers and college tutors, and participate in enrichment and motivational activities that make college seem attainable. As students progress in AVID, their self-image improves, they become academically successful leaders and are role models for other students.

The new Sumter High School Renewal Team analyzed test data, examined existing programs, and suggested new ones. This group of teachers, students, and community members examined the pervious school renewal plans and initiated goals that would help our students succeed academically. The goals the team developed are as follows:

- Continue to assist all students in successfully passing coursework and high stakes tests.
- Continue to increase the number of 9th grade students earning a High School diploma in four years and ultimately exceeding each year's graduation rate.
