Dear Parents/Guardians:

Sumter High School is making great strides to improve on the absolute and growth ratings of AVERAGE it received on the 2013 Annual School Report Card. In addition, based on the ESEA Federal Accountability System (which replaced the old AYP federal accountability system in S.C.), Sumter High earned a C rating. The C rating is described in this manner: "Performance meets the state's expectations." This C rating has encouraged us to continue to implement new programs and strategies to ensure continuous improvement. With that being said, our graduation rate of 78.8% continues to be higher than schools like ours. We are proud of the accomplishments of our students and staff.

A major new program being developed for Sumter High School is the AVID program (to start in the 2014 – 2015 school year). AVID is an approved elective course taken during the school day. Current 9th Grade students will be selected to enroll in an AVID class as one of their electives. For one class period a day, they learn organizational and study skills, work on critical thinking and asking probing questions, get academic help from peers and college tutors, and participate in enrichment and motivational activities that make college seem attainable. As students progress in AVID, their self-images improve, and they become academically successful leaders and role models for other students.

As we continue to prepare the students of Sumter High School for future endeavors, the support of the community will be vital to making this effort a success. Students today need more knowledge and skill leaving high school than ever before. We thank the community for all you have done this year and will continue to do in the future. Your input and cooperation as we reshape the school climate at Sumter High is needed. We ask that if you receive a survey or a request to attend a meeting, please make every effort to participate so that your voice can be heard. Thanks for all you do for the students at Sumter High School.

Sumter High School Needs Assessment

The new Sumter High School Renewal Team analyzed test data, examined existing programs, and suggested new ones. This group of teachers, students, and community members examined the previous school renewal plans and initiated goals that would help our students succeed academically. The goals the team developed are as follows:

- The percentage of students who meet the requirements on EOC will increase by 10% by 2017.
- The percentage of ninth grade students who earn a standard High School Diploma, and graduate in four years will increase by 10% by 2017.

During our school renewal planning process this year, the team agreed that Sumter High School should continue to focus on student achievement, teacher/administrator quality, and improving the school climate. After meeting with members from the community, students, and staff members, the team agreed to implement strategies to address the previously stated needs. We utilized information from test data, attendance reports and discipline reports. Surveys for students, parents, and staff members were included.
