Sumter High School Library

The Sumter High Library has a collection of more than 24,000 books, including eBooks and audiobooks. Our two-story library features a computer lab upstairs with 50 computers, plus more than 15 additional computers on the main floor. We have recently renovated, and our updated space offers more comfortable seating and an inviting environment.

Throughout the year, we offer fun reading activities like Blind Date with a Book, Book Passes, and Book Tastings. We also host an after-school book club and support the SCASL Young Adult Book Award Nominees.

Helpful resources available to students include the Destiny Library Catalog, DISCUS (provided by the State Library), and The Item newspaper, just to name a few.
