### STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

In the spring of 2015, Alice Drive Elementary third through fifth grade students took the ACT Aspire state assessment tests. Alice Drive Elementary had a higher percentage of students scoring at grade level or above than both the state and district averages in Math and above the district in English, Reading and Writing. The SC PASS was given to students in grades four and five in the spring of 2015. Alice Drive Elementary scored above the district and state averages of students scoring at grade level or above in both science and social studies.
