OUR SUCCESSES...

- Wilder Elementary School is an A+ School with an absolute rating of 99.3% on the ESEA/Federal Accountability System.
- Parents participate in workshops sponsored by the school to learn more about state standards for students in kindergarten through 5th grade.
- Community leaders and fathers participated in the "100 Day Celebration" and "100 Real Men Read" to our students.



- Wilder is a data driven school and will be a Certified Data Team school in May.
- SMART Board Interactive Systems and Computers are in every classroom.
- Wilder has single-gender classes in 3rd-5th grades.
- Wilder is part of the Looping Advances Teacher Teaming and Innovation Schools (LATTIS) supported by the Office of Improvement Committee.
- "Monday Morning Meetings" and "Early Morning Jumpstart" continue to promote classroom communities and basic educational principles.
- Parent Conference Nights are held twice a year. In the fall, parents have the opportunity to meet with teachers and discuss academic progress from the beginning of the year. In the Spring, teachers share all of the data compiled on each student and conduct a Prescriptive Data Conference. Parents are informed throughout the year of academic progress with weekly/biweekly progress reports and report cards.
- The U. S. Department of Education gave a grant to Special Olympics entitled, "Project UNIFY." Wilder participated in this project in an effort to promote opportunities for students.
- 64 students participate in the HYPE (Helping Youth Pursue Excellence) after school program.



The Soaring High Singers provided opportunities for students in grades 3rd—5th to practice and perform choral presentations at school and community functions.

The annual community **canned food drive, teddy bear project in honor of "Bear" Gibbons , and Veterans Day Celebration** provide opportunities for students to help their communities in many positive ways.

Students in grades Pre-K– 5th worked together to raise over \$400 for **Pennies for Patients**. This money was used to help fight Leukemia/Lymphoma. **Jump Rope for Heart** raised \$809 to give to the Heart Association. YMCA **Change a Life** campaign allowed students to focus on a local effort to send a child to camp from the Sumter area. Each grade level competed to bring in the most change.
