Classrooms are arranged for small /flexible grouping that allow for differentiated instruction to meet the needs of the learner.

Teachers participate in on-going embedded professional development that enhance instructional practices.

Teachers participate in Read to Succeed Professional Development.

Correlate instruction in science, social studies, math, and ELA.

Objective: During the 2015-2016 school year, Wilder Elementary student attendance will improve by 0.5%.

Evidence:
Teachers use SOAR passes, print certificates, and give perfect attendance awards.

Objective: During the 2015-2016 school year and in alignment with the School Renewal Plan, the number of days of out of school suspension will decrease by 5%.

Evidence:
Boys Into Gentleman (BIG) and Girls Into Real Ladies (GIRL) clubs will meet to do activities that promote appropriate behaviors.

Teachers will send notes home, make phone calls, and give SOAR passes to promote positive behavior.

Quarterly good behavior awards and incentives are given.

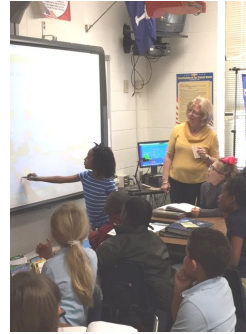

- Wilder's 5th grade students performed "Journey Through Time" for our community and school in celebration of Black History Month.
- Parents participated in workshops sponsored by the school to learn more about state standards for students in kindergarten through 5th grade.
- Community leaders and family members participated in the "Family Literacy Day".



Recognitions, Awards and Community Involvement

- Promethean Board Interactive Systems and Computers are in every classroom.
- Wilder has single-gender classes in 4th and 5th grades.
- Parent Conference Nights are held twice a year. In the fall, parents have the opportunity to meet with teachers and discuss academic progress from the beginning of the year. In the Spring, teachers share all of the data compiled on each student and conduct a prescriptive data conference. Parents are informed throughout the year of academic progress with weekly/biweekly progress reports and report cards.
- 48 students participate in the HYPE (Helping Youth Pursue Excellence) after school program.
- Wilder received a STEM grant that served 44 students after school. The after school program focused on science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.
- An after school tutoring program was used to assist students in all areas.



Title I Parent Workshops gave parents opportunities to interact with their children on grade level activities while learning about what their child was expected to learn in their current grade level.

Health and fitness are promoted by weekly **Fitness Fridays**.

The Soaring Singers provided opportunities for students in grades 3rd—5th to practice and perform choral presentations at school and community functions.

The annual community **canned food drive, teddy bear project in honor of "Bear" Gibbons, and Veterans Day Celebration** provide opportunities for students to help their communities in many positive ways.

Wilder participates and raises money for **Jump Rope for Heart, Relay for Life, United Ministries, and March of Dimes**.

Career Fairs were given to enhance students awareness of careers around town.
