Evaluation of Goals for 2009-2010

Goal 1:Implement a school-wide mentoring program for students by partnering with local businesses and churches

The mentoring program gained support in the community and local businesses. Informational meetings and trainings were conducted by the guidance counselor and school social worker. Identified students were partnered with mentors who met with the students on a regular basis. The program had a positive effect on student discipline.

Goal 2: Strengthen the language arts and mathematics programs to improve achievement as measured by grade level standards and PASS

Our students continued to grow in the areas of language arts and mathematics. Professional development in both areas enhanced student learning. Students were provided with multiple opportunities to read and write through school-wide reading incentives, writing contests, family activities, and individualized instruction. Mathematics continued to show improvements as students became engaged with technology and problem solving strategies.

Goal 3: Strengthen the social studies and science program to improve achievement as measured by grade level standards and PASS

Students were engaged in social studies and science with field studies, experiments, and the use of technology. Classroom libraries contained an abundance of non-fiction literature, which provided students with the knowledge and understanding of grade-level social studies and science standards. With the use of video streamlining students were able to experience the content and gained valuable information in history and real-life scientific topics. Projects and experiments were an important aspect of the social studies and science program.

Goal 4: Enhance professional development of certified and non-certified staff to provide high-quality instruction

Teachers and support staff were provided with on-going professional development in the areas of technology, writing strategies, best practices, problem solving strategies, and classroom management. Teachers attended workshops and seminars to gain knowledge in their content areas to increase their effectiveness of instructional practices. Graduate classes were also offered through the district and provided teachers with current information regarding best practices, technology, and classroom management.

The 2009-2010 school year consisted of several accomplishments. In English/language arts, 89.7% of our fifth graders met standards on the PASS test, which was an increase of 13.4% from the previous year. In mathematics, our students continue to work diligently to increase their scores. Our school successfully implemented a new school-wide initiative in the area of math problem solving. Students are excited about math and are making growth in their skills and problem solving abilities. Parent involvement also has shown an increase by the number of parents attending PTA meetings, conferences, the parent resource center, and other school functions.
