

Summary of Needs Assessment

Willow Drive Elementary School Renewal Plan committees, district and school level administrators analyzed data from the Palmetto Assessment of State Standards, MAP, the Annual School Report Card, and Powerschool Reports. After reviewing all the data, strategies and activities were developed based on specific areas of strength and weakness identified in the data.

Based on the 2015 ESEA Waiver scores from the state report card, Willow Drive Elementary is outperforming schools with similar demographics. Schools will not be rated for state accountability until Fall 2017. Longitudinal analysis of the SC-PASS and ACT/Aspire data indicates target areas for growth are: Science, Social Studies, ELA, and Math.
