SIC Annual Goals

The goals of the SIC for the 2021-2022 school-year were:

- By the end of the 2020-2021 school year, reduce the number of third grade students scoring Does Not Meet on SC Ready ELA assessment from 50% to 45% as determined by 2018-2019 SC Ready Data.
- By the end of the 2020-2021 school year, reduce the number of third grade students scoring Does Not Meet on the SC Ready Math assessment from 44% to 39% as determined by 2018-2019 SC Ready Data.

The School improvement council targeted more family involvement and workshops to help parents understand their child's scores as well as the content being taught in their classes. FPES held a parent meeting to discuss and review MAP scores and ways parents can help their child improve their map scores. Foster Park Elementary School plans to hold a parenting testing workshop to provide parents tools and strategies to help with state testing.
