SIC Annual Goals

The goals of the SIC for the 2022-2023 school-year were:

- By the end of the 2021-2022 school year, reduce the number of third grade students scoring Does Not Meet on SC Ready ELA assessment from 47.3% to 44.3%.
- By the end of the 2021-2022 school year, reduce the number of third grade students scoring Does Not Meet on the SC Ready Math assessment from 50% to 47%.
- By the end of the 2021-2022 school-year, guided reading and guided math will be implemented in teachers' classrooms.

To strengthen communication between home and school, Foster Park Elementary School held a series of Present Parenting Workshops. The purpose of these workshops was to provide parents with parenting tips, reading strategies, and family reading ideas.
