Performance Goal Area: School Climate

- Goal 1: Reduce the incidence of in and out of school suspensions.
- Maintain home/school relations as noted by annual school survey responses.

Our results: For the 2013-2014 school year, the number of in-school suspensions increased from 7 to 31 while the number of out-of-school suspensions increased from 26 to 31. In the 2014 survey, 63.2% of parents are satisfied with home/school relations, which is a decrease from 80.7% on the 2013 survey.

Performance Goal Area: Student Achievement

- Goal 1: Students in all subgroups will meet or exceed the Annual Measureable Objectives for student performance in ELA, mathematics, science and social studies.
- Create and sustain a college-going and career readiness culture throughout grades K-4.

Our results: In 2014, no subgroup met the AMO in ELA, mathematics, science, or social studies. However, in 3rd grade the percentage of students scoring "Met" and "Exemplary" in math increased. Females were closer to meeting the AMO in ELA.

Performance Goal Area: Teacher and Administrator Quality

- Goal 1: 100% of classes will be taught by Highly Qualified teachers as defined by No Child Left Behind.
- Goal 2: Increase the diversity of the workforce
- Encourage and train district personnel for upward mobility

Our results: 100% of classes are taught by Highly Qualified teachers. Jefferson will only hire teachers who meet this standard. The diversity of our workforce increased by one employee this year.

Challenges We Face

Jefferson's poverty rate is at 73.41%, making it the second highest in York School District One.

Science and social studies scores are declining.

57% of tested grade teachers have 3 years or less of classroom experience.
