Sixth graders designed and tested carnival games while learning about simple machines.

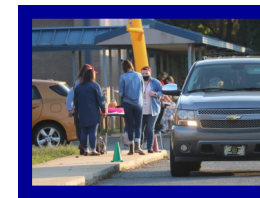
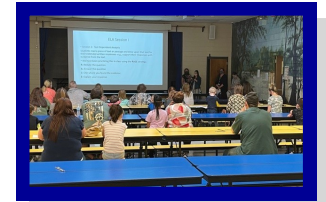


Second graders designed self-propelled boats and cars and hosted a race to test their designs.
