- \* Teaching and learning should be relevant, individualized, and intentional to equip students for success.

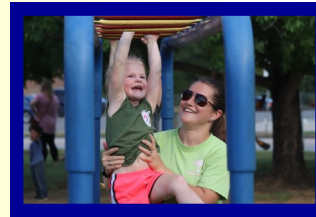
### Parent Teacher Organization
