School Renewal Plans are created every five years. Faculty and staff reflect upon data and survey information to establish goals for the next five-year period. Hunter Street's plan for 2017-2021 includes the following goals:

Performance Goal Area: School Climate

By 2021, 100% of school level respondents completing the "YSD1 School and Safety Climate" survey will report positive feelings regarding safety as evidenced by responses of "4" or "5".

Performance Goal Area: Student Achievement

By 2035, 70% of Hunter Street students will score level 3 (Meets Expectations) or higher on the ELA and Math portions of SC READY.

By 2035, 70% of Hunter Street fourth grade students will score level 3 (Meets Expectations) or higher on the Science portion of SC PASS.

Performance Goal Area: Teacher and Administrator Quality

By 2021, increase the number of GT (Gifted and Talented) endorsed teachers from 2 to 4 in grades 3 and 4.

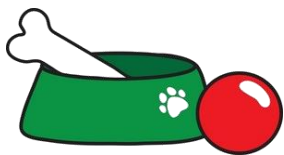

2017-2018 School Report Cards

Hunter Street Elementary School is dedicated to providing our students with a diverse and innovative education in a safe environment. This year the South Carolina State Department of Education (SCDE) along with the Educational Oversight Committee (EOC) developed a new school report card that released categorized ratings for schools. The newly revised report card was designed to provide stakeholders with an overview of academic achievement, student progress, classroom environment and several other areas. As you compare Hunter Street to the district and state, keep in mind that Hunter Street's percentages include 3rd and 4th grade test scores, while district and state percentages include grades 3-8. Another new item on the report card includes the percentage of 2nd grade students "on track for success in English Language Arts and Math at the third grade level." Using MAP data, we as a district determined that we would report the percentage of students in second grade who had approximately a 75% chance to achieve "Meets Expectations" or "Exceeds Expectations" when they take the third grade SC READY assessment. At Hunter Street, we found that 28% of students in ELA and 40% of students in Math were on track to score either "meets expectations" or "exceeds expectations" on the 3rd grade SC READY assessment. This criterion was not set by the state, so schools and districts reported differently. These culminating ratings reflect performances that align with college-and-career readiness. We will continue to provide college and career readiness through the implementation of rigorous standards in language arts and math and will continue to spark potential and inspire success in York School District Number One.
