## Evaluation of School Renewal Plan Goals for 2009-2010

 Griggs Road Elementary students will exceed the school's 2009-2010 percentage of students scoring met and exemplary on the writing section of PASS.

Griggs Road Elementary students raised the percentage of students scoring met or exemplary on the Writing PASS from 75.9% to 86% in 2009-2010.

- Griggs Road Elementary students will exceed the school's 2009-2010 percentage of students scoring met and exemplary on the English/language arts section of PASS. Griggs Road Elementary student raised the percentage of students scoring met or exemplary on the ELA PASS from 92% to 94.8% in 2009-2010.
- Griggs Road Elementary students will exceed the school's 2009-2010 percentage of students scoring met and exemplary on the mathematics section of PASS.
   Griggs Road Elementary students raised the percentage of students scoring met or exemplary on the Math PASS from 88.6% to

## Goals for 2010-2011

2010-2011 began a new series of goals under the 2010-2016 School Renewal Plan. The following goal statements are adjusted from the School Renewal Plan to reflect one year's anticipated change.

#### School Climate

The percentage of parents satisfied with homeschool relations as measured by the State Report Card Survey will increase from 68% in 2009-2010 to 70% in 2010-2011.

The percentage of students satisfied with the social and physical environment of our school (hallways, classrooms, cafeteria, and playground) as measured by the State Report Card Student Climate Survey will increase from 54% in 2010-2011 to 59% in 2010-2011.

## Student Achievement

The percentage of students in grades 2-5 who meet the expected one-year's growth in Reading and Math as measured by fall to spring MAP assessments will increase to 55.8% and 43%, respectively, in 2010-2011.

The percentage of students scoring Exemplary in ELA, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and Writing will increase to the targeted benchmarks in each subject area.
