Castle Heights Middle School is helping all students develop the world class skills, and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the SC Graduate by continuously seeking ways to improve and expand our instructional programs. Effective and rigorous instruction supports students' development of the knowledge, skills, and characteristics they will need to be successful as they move through middle school, high school, and to career and higher education goals beyond.

Instruction, collaboratively planned and assessed to focus on essential standards, challenged and engaged students with a wide range of resources. Strategies were implemented to support classroom instruction at a tier that is effective for all students, and revisions to our Enrichment program allowed for a further tier to focus on individual student needs. Professional development and teacher conferences supported these efforts to make the school's classroom instruction and tiered extensions as effective as possible. Our Positive Behavioral Intervention System "PBIS" REACH (respect, effort, accountability, community, honor), serves as a means to cultivate a positive school climate for students and staff.
