FUTURE Plans

In Fall of 2025, we are proud to launch a dynamic antibullying campaign focused on fostering a culture of respect, empathy, and unity. Under the theme "Stand Up, Speak Out, Be Kind", students, staff, and families will come together through engaging activities, including studentled assemblies, peer support workshops, and a week of themed events designed to raise awareness and promote positive behaviors.

PROGRESS ON SIC GOALS

Our School Improvement Council convenes monthly on the third Tuesday of each month. This year our primary goal was to create and implement action teams that focused on three areas: mental health, student and faculty recognitions, and student incentives. Our SIC worked as three action teams to create and promote the following initiatives:

- Mental Health: Pre-planning for an Anti-Bullying Kindness Matters campaign to launch in Fall 2025.
- Student and Faculty Recognitions: Student of the month recognitions through our Student Lighthouse Team and Teacher of the Month/Difference Maker recognitions.
- Student Incentives: 2 Fun Lunches and an off campus movie field trip for students with excellent academics, attendance and discipline during first semester.

Additionally, in the Fall the SIC participated in the community Thanksgiving Boxes for Hunger & Homelessness Awareness Week. This Spring the SIC promoted a testing snack drive to ensure that all of our EOC testers had snacks on test days.
