PBIS Program “P.R.I.D.E.”

The PBIS program includes proactive strategies for teaching and supporting appropriate student behaviors. Our goal is to establish a positive school climate in which appropriate behavior is the norm

PBIS at a Glance

P.R.I.D.E— Our students demonstrate Rawlinson Road “PRIDE” which stands for *Perseverance, Responsibility, Integrity, Dependability, and Excellence*

All students receive a Raider card each quarter. Once a card is filled, students are able to participate in a school-wide PBIS celebration! There are 4 celebrations, one for each marking period. These celebrations consist of fun events such as a school dance, field day, movie/games, etc.
