Richmond Drive is a Title 1 School that receives federal funding based the poverty index level at our school. Funding is utilized to provide assistnace and educatoinal opportunities for our students.

Title 1 funds were used for a Reading Recovery teacher, interventionist and math coach. Resources are also purchased with funds.
