At a Glance

- Gifted and Talented Endorsed teachers serve all students in grades PK-5.
- Acceleration is an ongoing instructional process by which educators engage in practices to improve access to and mastery of standards at each child's level.
- All students participate in (two) ten week cycles of Enrichment Clusters which take place on Fridays during the last hour of the school day. Cluster opportunities include: Garden Club, Basketball Basics, Spanish 101, Youthful Yoga, Card Sharks, Double Dutch, Kids That Code and many more.
- G/T cluster classes serve Gifted and Talented identified and academically advanced students in grades 3, 4, and 5.
- Opportunities for competitive teams and extracurricular activities span grades 3-5. Students participate in Robotics, Beta Club, Girls on the Run, Math Olympiads, Musical Performances, Let Me Run, and more.
- Interactive technology resources in all classrooms such as ABii Smart Tutor Robots.
- Acceleration resources, materials, and instruction are available to enrich your child's gifts and talents.
