Our school leadership team developed goals for student achievement based on MAPS and PASS test results. Our entire staff wrote our 2012-2013 school improvement plan to address these areas.

Goal #2: Provide information and facilitate parent education workshops to impact student achievement.
Our School Improvement Council made two presentations to parents regarding standards based report cards, home school communications, and providing academic support for students at home.

Goal #3: Offer staff development opportunities for teachers across grade levels.
